



Possessive Adjectives with Examples

What Are Possessive Adjectives?

Possessive adjectives are basically the following words: my, your, his, her, its, our, your, and their. They are used to talk about ownership or possession of something.

Examples:

- I will give **you** my bike.
- Where is **your** watch?
- Can I come to **their** home?
- That's **her** cat.
- I meet **his** cousin last night.
- **Our** house is large.

Possessive Adjectives or Possessive Pronouns?

Possessive adjectives are often confused with possessive pronouns.

To avoid this mistake, consider the following table that helps to distinguish them:

Subject Pronouns		I	You	Не	She	It	We	You	They
Possessive	Adjectives	My	Your	His	Her	Its	Our	Your	Their
	Pronouns	Mine	Yours	His	Hers	Its	Ours	Yours	Theirs

Possessive adjectives are the words:

my, your, his, her, its, our, your, and their.

Possessive pronouns are the words: mine, yours, his, its, ours, yours, theirs.

More Examples:

- My father is a policeman.
- I fixed **your** broken laptop.
- **His** wife is very annoying.
- Is that **her** new car?
- I love Christmas with **its** exciting atmosphere.
- Our house is large.
- I really like **your** kids because they are very respectful.
- I was in **their** town and it is very beautiful.

Types of Pronouns:

Compare the possessive adjectives with the rest of other pronouns using the following table:
